Your lesson plan

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Topic/Lesson Title: Bullying - Promoting an Inclusive in school

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Methodology:

The methodology used in the sessions: group, individual, brainstorming, group dynamics, role-playing, video visualization.

- Individual creating digital content
- Group / in pairs reflection, brainstorming, role-playing, teamwork and board game

Aims/Goals or SWBATs (Students will be able to.....)

By the end of the session, students will have activated the following skills:

- Educating on European core values
- Transmit and develop key competencies and good practices of active citizenship
- Recognize and respect cultural differences
- Promoting inclusion, equity, and respect
- Understanding fundamental human rights and democratic principles

Age group: 12 – 14 years old

Level:

Time (Lesson duration): 4 school hours - 1 hour per week for 1 month (four sessions)

Materials:

- Computers (for students and teacher) or mobile phone
- Projector or a screen
- Internet connection
- Live interactive word cloud tool (<u>Mentimeter</u> brainstorming and creating of a word and Quizizz
- Interactive online board (Google Classroom, Padlet, for collecting students' work
- A fun educational game: "Europe Matters A Question of Values"

Lead-in What's going to happen here to introduce your students to the topic? Time 15minutes

Using the paddlet and powerpoint, the teacher presents the content to be covered and the way in which the sessions will take place.

What can students predict or do to get started with the lesson? Time: 45minutes





Before starting the lesson, individual students can answer a quiz so that the teacher is aware of their level of knowledge about the topic.

Then, using mentimeter, the topics of rights and duties and inclusion will be covered. Together with the teacher, the students will analyze the answers and, through group work, will be able to make suggestions on "how can we work on inclusion?"

What vocabulary could teachers focus on? What needs to be pre-taught?

What kinds of activities can students do to deepen their knowledge? Time 2h

In groups, students could play a board game about the topic.

In pairs, they will role-play discrimination and the other students will reflect on what can be done.

What kinds of questions can students answer from the activities? What should they notice or analyze? 1hour

Students should have self-awareness and self-expression:

- Interpersonal skills: group projects and collaborative discussions improve students' interpersonal skills, teaching them effective communication and teamworking.
- Empathy: students develop an understanding of the potential negative consequences of online activities, fostering empathy for those who may be affected
- Critical thinking and problem solving: engaging in critical analysis and problem-solving activities help students to develop these essential life skills.
- Decision making and responsible choices: students learn how to make informed decisions about their online activities, considering potential risks



and benefits.

• Citizenship and social responsibility: the emphasis on responsible digital citizenship aligns with the broader concept of social responsibility, helping students in understanding their role in the broader digital and social context.

What are other follow up (or homework) activities that can be included?

Students can design poster (in a paper or a digital format) about the inclusion.
